

Geert Molenberghs is a Professor of Biostatistics at UHasselt and KU Leuven. He received a degree in Mathematics (1988) and a PhD in biostatistics (1993) from UAntwerpen. He published on surrogate markers in clinical trials and categorical, longitudinal, and missing data. He was Editor for Applied Statistics, Biometrics, and Biostatistics and is currently Executive Editor of Biometrics. He was President of the International Biometric Society. He is a Fellow of the American Statistical Association, received the Guy Medal in Bronze from the Royal Statistical Society, and held visiting positions at Harvard. He is the founding Director of the Center for Statistics at UHasselt and the Interuniversity Institute for Biostatistics and Statistical Bioinformatics (UHasselt and KU Leuven). He received research funding from FWO, IWT, the EU (FP7), U.S. NIH, U.S. NSF, UHasselt, KU Leuven, ECDC and EMA. He is a member of the Belgian Royal Academy of Medicine. He has been active (as an advisor, researcher and communicator) in the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic response.
